### **D-3 MINISTRY**

The faithful Christian, with a heart fixed on keeping their God-given ministry within the home their priority, steps into the church and every additional part of life to shepherd others toward God and the gospel.

## **HISTORY OF THE BIBLE**

### **INSPIRATION**

“God superintended the human authors of the Bible so that they composed and recorded without error His message to mankind in the words of their original writings.” (C. Ryrie, Basic Theology, 38)

### **INERRANCY**

“The inerrancy of Scripture means that Scripture in the original manuscripts does not affirm anything that is contrary to fact” (Grudem, 90)

### D1- Proverbs 4:23 — Guard your heart

23 *Watch over your heart with all diligence, For from it flow the springs of life.*

### D2-Ephesians 5:22-33 — Instruction for husbands and wives

### D3-Ephesians 4:14-16 — Body causes the growth of the body

- 14 *As a result, we are no longer to be children, tossed here and there by waves and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by the trickery of men, by craftiness in deceitful scheming;*
- 15 *but speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in all aspects into Him who is the head, even Christ,*
- 16 *from whom the whole body, being fitted and held together by what every joint supplies, according to the proper working of each individual part, causes the growth of the body for the building up of itself in love.*

- 16 *All Scripture is inspired by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, for training in righteousness; 17 so that the man of God may be adequate, equipped for every good work.*
