DISCIPLINE 1,2,3 - Conflict Resolution [Maintaining Unity in the Bond of Peace]



The source of my conflicts:

- James 4:1-3
- Galatians 5:19-21

Sinful ways of avoiding conflict:

- Just keep quiet
- Stay away from one another
- Change the subject/Avoid the issue
- Hide information, sins or bitterness

God's design for unity and peace in the church:

- Ephesians 4:1-3, 11-13
- Romans 15:5-6
- I Corinthians 1:10
- II Corinthians 13:11
- I Thessalonians 5:11-18

God-honoring ways of navigating conflict:

- Make it your aim to glory God and please Him [I Corinthians 10:31; II Corinthians 5:9-10
- Be committed to pursue peace [Romans 12:18, Romans 14:19; Hebrews 12:14; James 3:17-18]
- Stay out of conflicts that do not involve you [Proverbs 26:17]
- Look to see your contribution to the conflict first [Matthew 7:3-5; James 4:1]
- Understand the danger of bitterness [Hebrews 12:15]
- Believe the best about the other person [I Corinthians 13:6-7; I Peter 4:8]



- Gather plenty of data before speaking [Proverbs 18:13, 17]
- Pray, study and think about the issue before speaking, if possible [Proverbs 15:28]
- Be self-controlled and loving in your speech [Proverbs 15:1; Ephesians 4:29]
- Demonstrate and/or communicate your love and care [Romans 12:9-10].
- Listen more than you speak, but do speak [Proverbs 10:19, 25:11].
- Regard the other person as more important than yourself [Philippians 2:2-3; Romans 12:16]
- In matters of preference, prefer the other person [Romans 12:10]
- Love, forgive, and clothe your heart with godly virtues [Colossians 3:12-14; I Peter 3:8-9]
- Avoid foolish arguments and controversies [I Timothy 6:3-6; II Timothy 2:23-26]



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MINISTRY PASSAGES

DISCIPLINE 1,2,3 [THE HEART, HOME, MINISTRY]

Ephesians 4:1-3— MAINTAIN UNITY IN THE BOND OF PEACE

- Therefore I, the prisoner of the Lord, implore you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling with which you have been called,
- 2 with all humility and gentleness, with patience, showing tolerance for one another in love,
- *being diligent to preserve the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace.*

Colossians 3:12-14— FORGIVE COMPLAINTS/PUT ON LOVE

- 12 So, as those who have been chosen of God, holy and beloved, put on a heart of compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience;
- 13 bearing with one another, and forgiving each other, whoever has a complaint against anyone; just as the Lord forgave you, so also should you.
- 14 Beyond all these things put on love, which is the perfect bond of unity.

Hebrews 12:14-15—PURSUE PEACE

- 14 Pursue peace with all men, and the sanctification without which no one will see the Lord.
- 15 See to it that no one comes short of the grace of God; that no root of bitterness springing up causes trouble, and by it many be defiled;
